

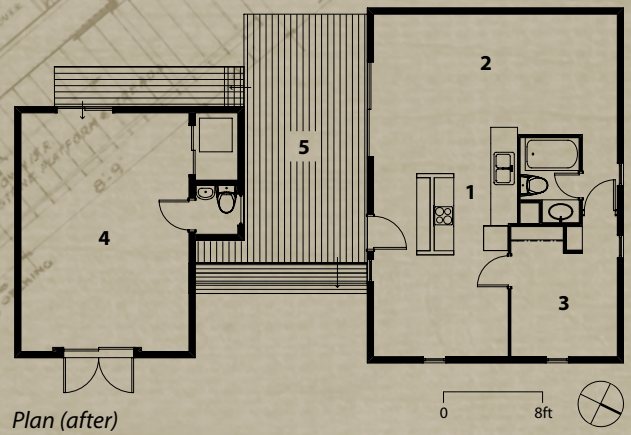

This 110-square-metre (1250-square-foot) home and studio is located in the East End Historic District of Provincetown, Massachusetts, a small artists colony at the very tip of Cape Cod. By enclosing a space where an outdoor deck had separated two buildings, this addition and comprehensive renovation linked a 55-square-metre (600-square foot) 1960s modern house built by an architecture professor and his students to a former garage converted to a painting studio, creating a single integrated residence.

The new program for the house provides a living room, a new master bedroom suite, two bathrooms and a large eat-in kitchen. The new living room, delineated from the kitchen by its wood floor, is divided into three spaces: a central seating area, a reading nook and a music space large enough to accommodate a baby grand piano. The central portion of the living room ceiling was raised with clerestories that naturally ventilate the space and create a dialogue between the house and the art studio, where new windows bring in much-needed natural light for painting. The interior spaces feature custom cabinetry, exposed post-and-beam construction and fir roof decking.
